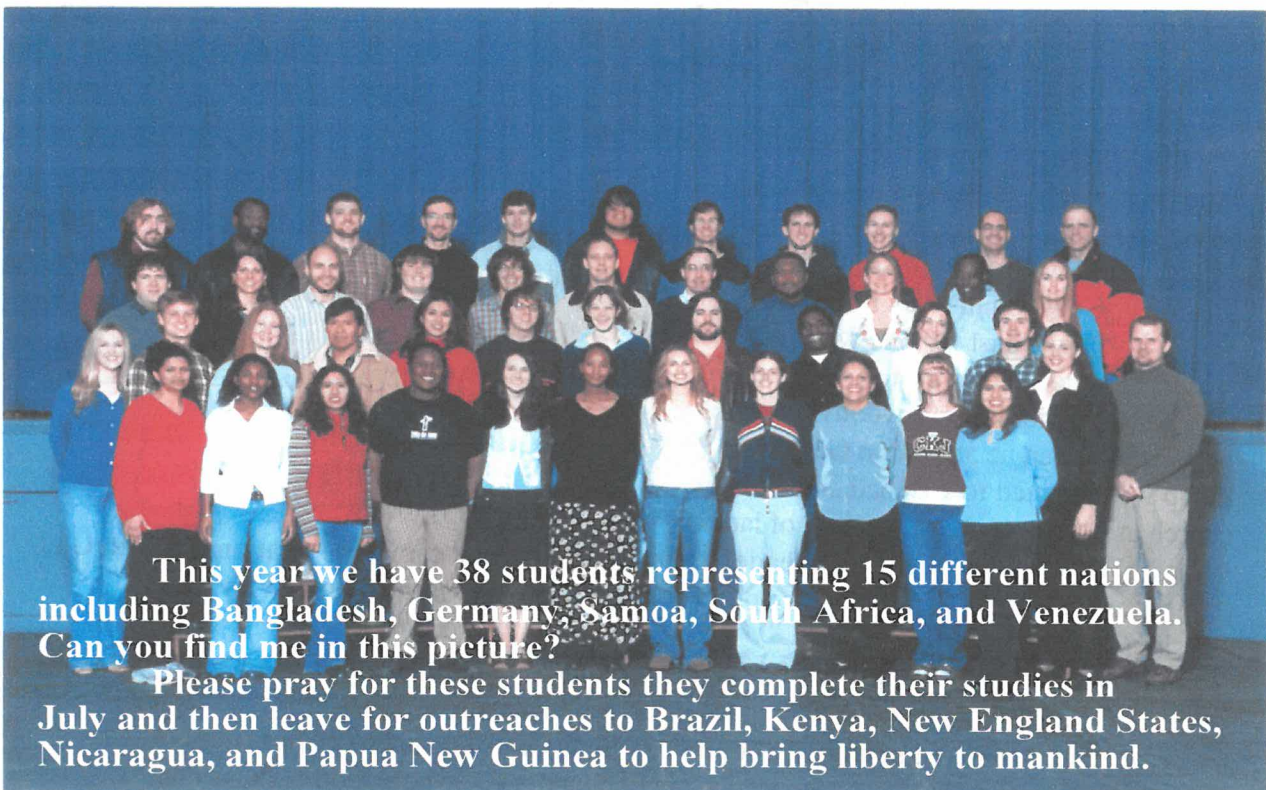

"Student Profile"



Philip is a kind and tender-hearted African man whom I have the opportunity this year to oversee pastorally. Before Philip came to do School of the Bible (SOTB) he was a journalist for a national radio station in Liberia, reporting the news until 1996.



Wanted to study journalism but, he was robbed by rebel fighters who fought in the Liberian civil war while crossing the border into Ivory Coast on his way to Ghana. Philip stayed in Ivory Coast for one week as a refugee and decided to go to Guinea even though he did not know anybody or, the language. When he arrived in Guinea, Philip was directed to a Canadian mission church as a place to sleep because of lack of money. While staying there, he attended church meetings and came into relationship with God. Philip was then directed to do a Discipleship Training School at the Youth With a Mission(YWAM) center in Guinea.

One year later, Philip went out on his own and taught at churches in several West African countries. Later, he joined YWAM's Mercy Ships in Benin Republic and served for more than two years and ministered in nineteen countries. Philip feels blessed to be in School of the Bible(SOTB) because it, "... deepened his understanding of whom God really is and to communicate the Gospel well. His long-term goal in life is to return to war-torn Liberia as a pastor/missionary and to start an SOTB. Philip and his classmates are young leaders studying Godly principles to teach individuals and nations and in the process help **bring liberty to mankind.**
