"Two Cans of Beans"

One of our School Of The Bible(SOTB) students for this year is Dylan along with his wife. Before coming to SOTB Dylan was a youth pastor for two years in Hagerman, Idaho. Dylan & Renae had already been discipled for about six years with some knowledge that is taught in SOTB. They came to receive more details, clarity from what they learned from beforehand and new direction for their future ministry. Their journey to SOTB began three years ago when they attended a Discipleship Training School(DTS) in March of 1997. When they began their DTS one of the leaders taught on families in the ministry and they felt led to start a family.

They were both surprised and concerned about having a baby because of the extra finances needed and the responsibilities that come with having a child. When they were ready to receive the responsibility of being parents, Renae became with child and were planning on the perfect natural home birth in December. When an ultra sound was done in November there were many medical complications with Jacob. The doctors could not see Jacob's stomach, and the fact that he was not growing were some of the concerns. During this time many people here at Youth With A Mission(YWAM)-Tyler were praying for Dylan, Renae, and Jacob. It was thought that an emergency C-section would be done in Dallas, but Tyler was sufficient. When Jacob was born he was only 1 lbs., 13 oz., but there was nothing wrong with him, and in fact he was very healthy. Renae stayed in the hospital for only one week, and when they released Jacob a month later, he weighted only 3 1/2 lbs. In December Dylan, along with Renae and Jacob went and did an outreach with YWAM-Dallas in a Hispanic community. Jacob was so small he could not fight off infection and had to stay in another room upstairs during ministry time. Nevertheless, many kids from the community wanted to see the baby so, Dylan did his best by describing Jacob as so small like two cans of beans.

"A New Beginning"




For the past two years I have been serving on staff with Teachers For the Nations(TFN) training school and working logistically in accounting, office, school and food purchasing for Dayspring Ministries(TFN, Christian Heritage School, School Of The Bible). This year is a new beginning with most of my logistical responsibilities delegated to other departments. Because of this, the opportunity has opened up for me to join School Of The Bible(SOTB) staff. My new responsibilities this year include helping to lead a small/pastoral care group, and a reflection group which discuss in a group setting topics

Also, I am the homework coordinator who collects, checks off the assignments due each day, give to graders to grade, and then enter the scores into a computer for students to receive credit with YWAM's University of the Nations. Finally, I am the classroom monitor every Friday who makes sure the class is managed efficiently, runs the sound and recording equipment (see picture below), and



helps the lecturer pass out handouts, or other items.



The changes this year are quite evident with several meetings for me to attend each week, including one that starts every
Monday morning at 6:30 a.m. Despite the new challenges, School Of The Bible(SOTB) staff is something that has been on my heart since doing my SOTB outreach to Kenya in 1997.

"Marguerite & Julia"

In 1996 when I came to School Of The Bible(SOTB) I met Marguerite and Julia who were staff and student respectively, for the 1996-97 school year. Since meeting them, I have come to know them not only as friends, but examples of missionaries who have a deep passion to spread the The Gospel. Marguerite came to Y.W.A.M. in 1994 where she attended a Discipleship Training School(DTS) in Worchester, in her home country of South Africa. During her DTS she was part of a missions outreach team sent to Zimbabwe. Marguerite was part of the SOTB class of 1995 during which time she was part of an outreach to the Barai people of Papua New Guinea, and since then has been part of SOTB staff. She shared with me that during her SOTB she learned, "... there are principles and practical tools from scripture which can actually be used to change nations." Marguerite told me a story of her returning to Papua New Guinea for a second outreach to the Barai in '97. One night she was walking along a river and discovered that from campfire to campfire groups of people were reading and studying scripture. These people were in large part studying scripture as a result of the first Bible training outreach that Marguerite had participated on in '95. Through this outreach and others her heart for equipping and training Christian leaders to train others is taking place. Please do keep Marguerite in your prayers as she is taking a break for six months in South Africa before resuming the ministry God has called her to.

Julia attended a Discipleship Training School at Y.W.A.M.'s Juncos, Puerto Rico training center and outreach in Nicaragua. Julia told me that during her Teachers For the Nations(TFN) training she learned that, "God's Word is practical to all areas of our lives and contains all the principles related to disciple and transform individuals and nations." In SOTB she learned, ". . . how important it is to have the right understanding of God's character because that will determine the way you will relate to God, and even view yourself. Many Christians don't have a good relationship with God because they doubt his character." Julia says her heart and passion is to see individuals and nations be transformed by the truth of God that sets people free.(Jn. 8:32) Please keep Julia in your prays as she will be helping to coordinate outreaches for SOTB in the upcoming year.

"An American Patriot"



By now, many of you have seen this summer's movie, "The Patriot," that tells the fictional story of one man from South Carolina who fought in The Revolutionary War. While many elements in this movie are true and based upon actual events, let me tell you about the story of a real American hero. Benson J. Lossing wrote in, "Washington and the American Republic," that, the writer of certain letters came from, ". . . a chaplain in the Leacock battalion, many of whom members of his congregation, was afterward the revered pastor of the old church at Freehold, New Jersey, wherein William Tennent had preached. He was also chaplain at Valley Forge, to which he repaired with every male member of his congregation; for in those days politics were preached in the pulpits, and men were led to action on the side of freedom by faithful pastors. The eminent . . . Muhlenberg(pictured at left) was one of this stamp."

When the war for independence was kindling, he was a clergyman in Virginia, and at the close of 1775, he concluded a sermon with the words of Scripture: 'There is a time for all things-a time to preach and a time to pray;'(Ecol. 3) but those times he, said, had passed away; and then, in a (cont. next page)

(cont.) voice that sounded like a trumpet-times he, said, had passed away; and then, in a blast through the church, he exclaimed: 'There is a time to fight, and that time has now come'". Then laying aside his sacerdotal gown, he stood before his flock in the full uniform of a Virginia colonel. He ordered the drums to be beaten at the church door for recruits; and almost the entire male audience, capable of bearing arms, joined his standard. Nearly three hundred men enlisted under his banner on that day." Later, Colonel Muhlenberg became General Muhlenberg and is pictured along with other American commanding officers at George Washington receiving Lord Cornwallis' sword(which never took place, but instead Cornwallis sent his second in command and therefore, Washington did the same) at The Battle of Yorktown.







Personal Note

Dear Family and Friends,

Greetings again from Texas!

It has been a while since I have sent you a personal note and share with you what has personally been going on in my life.

With the new school year already started, I am renewed with the vision here at Y.W.A.M.-Tyler which is a discipling center that pioneers new ministries all over the world. There have been times when I have questioned the purpose of my involvement here in Texas, but in recent months have come to an understanding of the important role I am playing in The Kingdom of God. Even though I am not somewhere in Africa, Asia or South America, I am a missionary here helping to maintain the daily operations and helping to train future Christian leaders from around the world. In a war you need individuals to be in the front lines to help establish a beachhead, but to maintain that beachhead people need to come in and secure that position. My role here is as one who trains up others to go into the mission field and helps keep sending wave after wave of trained people into the front lines. If all the missionaries were to go into the front lines at the same time, there would be nobody to prepare the next wave of people when the first wave needed reinforcements. During the Persian Gulf War, for every one person who was in the front lines, there were at least three people who were helping to maintain and support the fighting men. Another example of my role here can be compared to the Apollo space program. For every manned flight to the moon that occurred, there were many people who worked behind the scenes and help made sure that those three astronauts left and returned safely to Earth.

God is the One who deserves the praise for directing me here and maintaining His ministry. I would also like to thank the many people who God directed, through their prayers and sponsorship. They have with God's help, enabled me to stay, serve here and disciple future Christian leaders from around the world.

He told me that he stayed and did not venture outside his sister's house for three months for fear of being killed.

Germain completed both specialized Y.W.A.M. training schools at Dayspring Ministries which are School Of The Bible(SOTB) and Teachers For the Nations(TFN). Through TFN, Germain received the strategy and skill of how to disciple a nation through education. In his TFN class, Germain would ask questions not only to satisfy his curiosity, but with the idea of taking these answers home and teach his fellow countrymen. One of the questions Germain asked was, "What do you do with mass murderers?" Germain is currently working with Y.W.A.M. in Kigali, Rwanda with Discipleship Training Schools and helping Youth Evangelical Ministries at his home church. Dear Family and Friends,

Greeting again from Tyler, Texas!

Many things have happened in the past several months since my last update, but God has been faithful to disciple and challenge me in my relationship with Him.

Up until Christmas, my schedule was very busy with multiple responsibilities and taking a college course at the same time. My focus, encouragement, and strength during this time, came from being busy and accomplishing a lot of stuff, but that was not where God wanted my heart. 

"The Year in Review"

Hello all and greetings once again from Texas! It is incredible that six years have past when I started my Discipleship Training School with Youth With A Mission(YWAM - pronounced Y-WAM) here in Tyler. YWAM is an international interdenominational humanitarian and missions organization with more than 14,000 full-time volunteer staff from over 200 denominations, representing 135 countries and 25,000 short-term missionaries in more than 600 mission centers in 144 counties.



Since graduating from Teachers For the Nations(TFN) last May(pictured above here with Mr. James Kilkenny, Director of TFN), I returned to being on staff with YWAM-Tyler, serve with TFN and in administration at the Dayspring Training Center. This ministry trains individuals who have the potential to be leaders in their own countries. Last year more than 35 people came from countries like Rwanda, Romania, England, Canada, Mexico, Germany, India, Japan, Brazil, Switzerland, Puerto Rico, Togo, Sierra Leon, and Guatemala. These individuals then participated and led outreaches to Nicaragua, Nepal, Kenya, Peru, Bolivia, Mexico, and Idaho, where they applied what they learned on the mission field.

"Two Interpretations of History"

In Teachers For the Nations(TFN) I have studied principles, ideas, and ways about educating others. One is how people study history and what presuppositions are being taught from one generation to the next. I understand how if history is taught as a subject as just facts and dates, then individuals loose identity, and value of what their purpose in life is. If people come to an understanding that history is a continuation which includes them and an active God that has a plan for their country and them, they then have a purpose in life. The following quote sums up the principle this way:

"The more throughly a nation deals with its history, the more decidedly will it recognize and own an over-ruling Providence therein, and the more religious a nation will it become; while the more superficially it deals with its history, seeing only secondary causes and human agencies, the more irreligious will it be."
